2.1 In addition to the five international ground-air visual signal codes outlined, four additional signals are required for use within Canada **only**:

LL — All is well

F — Require food and water
L — Require fuel and oil
W — Need repairs

5.2.3 i) The competent area control centre (ACC), not the rescue coordination centre (RCC), is responsible for notifying the appropriate accident investigation authorities about the distress phase.
